FR. ERIC'S RAMBLINGS – VENERABLE LUCIA – THE LONELY MARIAN APOSTLE – PT. 7



Let's look at Sr. Lucia's life from the visit of the angel in 1916 to the Miracle of the Sun in October of 1917 and the death of her cousins. Lucia's beautiful childhood, her wonderful relationship with her mother would change drastically in 1917, when Blessed Jacinta announced to the village that they had seen the Beautiful Lady. Lucia's mother was horrified that her daughter would lie and deceive the village. She tried everything she could think of to convince Lucia to tell the truth. She even forcibly brought Lucia to the pastor to get Lucia to tell the truth. This encounter caused Lucia to struggle with the idea that the devil could be deceiving them. As she overcame the fear and doubt, then she had to overcome the local government that tried to prevent the children from seeing Our Lady in August, but also to find out the secret of Fatima. The government threatened to have them boiled alive in oil, threw them in jail and continued to threaten the children with death, but Lucia and her cousins remained firm in their obedience to the wishes of Mary. Lucia had to deal with three tragic deaths after the Miracle of the Sun in October of 1917. Francisco and Jacinta died shortly after the Miracle of the Sun: Francisco within two years and Jacinta in February 1920. Lucia's father passed away and she suffered greatly over his death. Her sorrow was compounded by the fact that he had been the one person in her family who defended her when everyone else doubted the apparitions.

After the death of her cousins and her father, Lucia was tormented by the endless interrogations and was in danger of falling victim to the epidemic that claimed the life of her cousins. Some people were concerned and even fearful for her life, that she might be kidnapped or even killed (remember the threats of the government) to silence her. People wanted to find a safe place for Lucia.

To make matters worse for her, the pastor left suddenly and many blamed Lucia. Sr. Lucia wrote of this in her memoirs:

"The good priest grew more and more displeased and perplexed with regard to the apparitions, until one day he finally left the town. The news spread that His Reverence had left because of me, because he did not want to assume any responsibility for the events. Since he was a zealous pastor, greatly loved by the people, I suffered a lot because of this. Some pious women when meeting me would vent their disgust by insulting me, and sometimes they would send me away with a few slaps and kicks."

Lucia would reveal in a footnote that the real reason for the priest leaving was because of a difficulty that arose with the parishioners over the building of a new church.

Trouble seemed to follow Lucia everywhere, as she wrote, "On these trips (when she was away from home) I didn't always meet with esteem or kindness. On one side, there were people who admired me and thought I was a saint, but there were always others who insulted me and called me a hypocrite, a visionary and a witch."

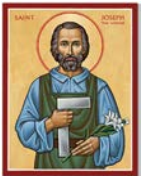

“Twinning” Celebrates Its 10-Year Anniversary – Part 2

• 2014-2024 •

A partnership with Piqua Mission Commission/Twinning Team and St. John/St. Lewis Parish in Portsmouth, Dominica*

There is a dire need for our friends in Dominica to complete the ceiling and roof of the new St. John St. Lewis Church prior to approval of their official church consecration. Among their own fundraisers, they have even launched an annual rummage sale like we do in Piqua to see this project to its completion! The Twinning Team returned from Dominica in January 2023 with a request to open the general appeal to our own parish community to assist. Here is a heartfelt letter from a native of Dominica, to you:

Thank you for your friendship and support over the past 10 years in helping to rebuild our beloved St. John St. Lewis Roman Catholic Church in Portsmouth, Dominica. Thanks also to Father Eric for allowing me this opportunity to address a current need.

By way of introduction, I am Dr. Montgomery (Monty) Douglas, a native son of Dominica. Like many of my generation, I have moved away from Dominica due to limited opportunities. I currently serve as the Department Chair of Family and Community Medicine of the State University of New York.

When our parish church in Dominica was destroyed by an earthquake in 2004, it was devastating. That church is the center of our Catholic community in Portsmouth. I and several others in our New York area formed a rebuilding committee to assist...the New York Portsmouth Roman Catholic Church Rebuilding Initiative. We raised funds by holding Festivals and bazaars and whatever way we could to assist in the rebuilding effort.

The introduction of the Twinning Team for our parishes, under the direction of Father Tom Bolte and Father Herman Sharplis in 2014, has been a wonderful experience. Friendships have been formed, horizons have been broadened and the true Love of God has shown forth in the relationship. The Piqua Parishes' contributions of the window coverings, stained glass, statuary and pews provided a significant assist in completing the church. The church has been in full use since 2017.

...We are so close to final completion. The church mandates certain physical attributes be completed prior to the formal consecration of the facility...We need to complete the interior ceiling area and repair some roof damage prior to consecration. That is the need.

Our goal is to raise \$185,000 US (\$500,000 EC). If you are able, please consider a donation to assist. My understanding is that the donations can be put into the regular collection in an envelope marked “Twinning – Roof Repair.”

God bless you and all you do for St. John St. Lewis!

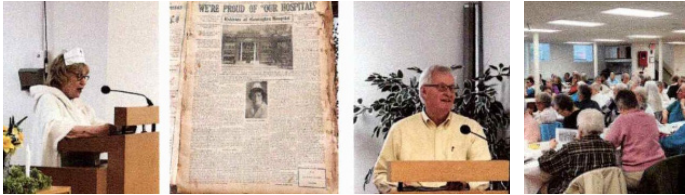

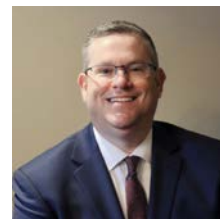
